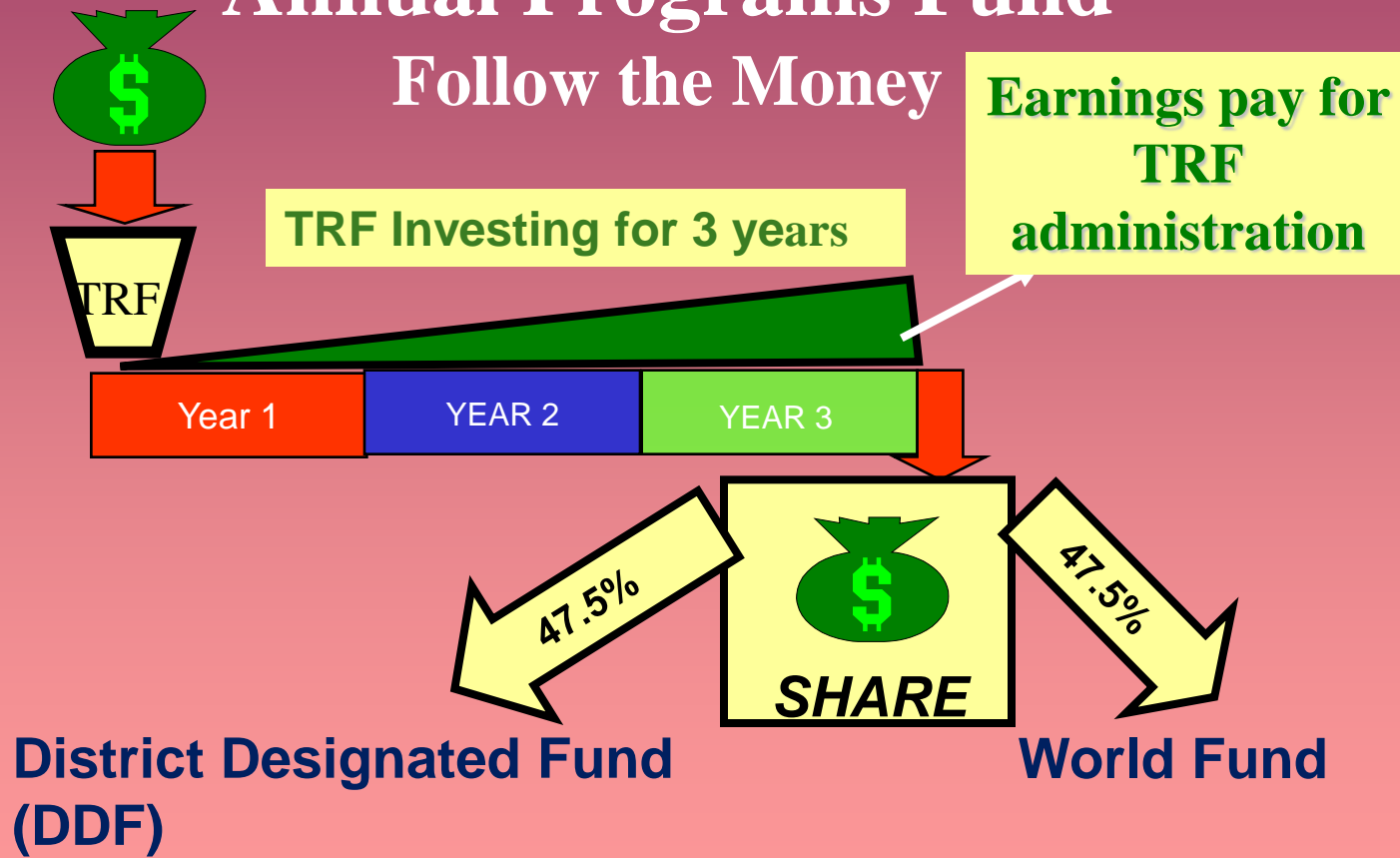
Three Main Funds

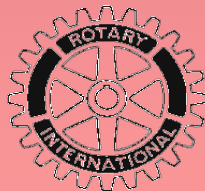
